

CHURCH GROWTH - Our church “grows” as our members “**grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ**” (2 Peter 3:18b, NKJV). Whether we grow in total numbers or not, we grow and are strengthened by our Lord through His Word and Sacrament. So that we may grow together as a church, I will offer a series of three studies – Old Testament, New Testament, and Didache (a topical study of Christian faith and life). Old Testament and New Testament will both be offered this fall, beginning September 13 (Another New Testament Class is already taking place on Wednesdays at 7:30). Each study will consist of a series of classes that give you some of the basic tools and history needed to understand the Bible and how you live the Christian life. More information on this and other opportunities to grow in Christ will be coming soon! I pray that all our members will be able to attend and grow together as God’s people. -Pastor Burfiend

“The Pentecost season is the longest season of the Church Year. It can be as long as 27 weeks, depending on the date of Easter. The liturgical color of the Pentecost season is green, denoting the growth of the branches as we are sustained and fed by the Vine.

“As one considers the Gospel readings appointed for the Sundays after Pentecost, three major theological themes emerge. The first theme, uniting the seven Sundays after the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, is that of the miracles of Jesus interspersed with His teachings about the true Church. In these we see the great wonders performed by our Lord as evidence of His Divinity, and His will to continue His miraculous works as He comes to us now in His Means of Grace, strengthening and growing His Church. His Redeemed live out their earthly lives with our eyes fixed on Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of our faith.

“In the [eighth through the 18th Sundays after Trinity], we see the miracles of our Lord interspersed with His teachings regarding the Kingdom of God. Here we learn that the Kingdom of God is not like the Kingdom of the World, and we are shown the signs of both - the Kingdom of the World is marked by false prophets, unjust stewards, Pharisees and lepers; the Kingdom of God is marked by true Prophets, by repentance and faith, by healing and humility, and by love for God and neighbor.

“Beginning with Michaelmass, on September 29th, the Gospel readings for the remaining Sundays of the Church year turn our attention to the end times, the final judgment, and the coming in glory of our Lord.”
